FINDING MODULES IN TUMonline.

A module consists of one ore more courses (studio/lecture/workshop/seminar) with aligned content and gives a certain amount of credits (ECTS).

Please always indicate in your Learning Agreement the module code (for Architecture, AR00000 or ED120000)/title, not the course code (0000001234)/title.

Here are two routes to help you search for modules in the TUMonline system.

ROUTE 1 (study tree – advised)

3. Choose "degree programs"



4. Scroll down until you get to "98 Exchange program" and click on the small arrow, then on **Architecture**.



5. The list of modules for the Exchange program of that year will appear as below.

6. Expand the module selection of the ED Subject Area Architecture, then Architecture



You will so be able to see the Architecture modules which are open to Incoming students.

On the right-hand side, you can see a book symbol and, in the column "credits", the number of ECTS this module has.




7. If you click on the little book symbol, a new tab will open with further information about level, language, work load and other useful information.

For more information, click on "Go to Module Details".



This page will appear (in this case I opened the module AR30044 Adaptive Building Concepts):



In the overview you can see again the module title and code which you will need for your Learning Agreement and later for the examination, how many credits this module is worth and the Chair to whom it belongs. Scrolling down, you can find the title of the course/s and of the exam/s (the exam title is usually the same as the module title, the course name not necessarily), examination information, prerequisites, etc.

8. When you close this tab, you'll see again the page with the curriculum tree illustrated at point 6. Here you can also expand the module details directly and so find out the details of the exam/s and of the course/s belonging to this module. The orange diamond is the module node, the green dot is the exam node, the red triangle the course node. Again, the exam title is usually the same as the module title, the course(s) name not necessarily.



If you want to know if the course(s) took place in the last winter/summer semester, just expand the course node (red triangle) and click on the arrow before the current academic year. In this case, you can see the course took place in the summer term 24 (24S), so you can assume it will probably take place in the next summer term too.



ROUTE 2 (module catalogue)



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
- 1. Click on "continue without login"
- 2. Depending on your browser, you might need to change the language to English




3. Choose "Module Catalog"




4. Under "Organisation" start typing "Architecture", you will get "TUS2DP2 Department of Architecture". You will then have the list of all the modules offered in Architecture.



5. You can just scroll the pages or look for modules using key words in the filter mask. The example here uses the word "drawing"



6. If you want to know more about a module, in my case here "Water Colour Drawing", click on the module title



You can first see which Chair teaches this module, how many credits it has, then scrolling down you will also find more information about prerequisites, language of instruction and in which semester the module takes place, the title of the corresponding course(s) and exam(s).

IMPORTANT:

Please note that, using this second route, you can find all modules that have ever been offered in Architecture, also

- 1) the ones that are not valid anymore. In this case, something will be written beside "Valid until" and
- 2) the ones that are not in the curriculum of exchange students. In this case, please check with the responsible Chair if you can actually take the module and, if so, let us know (incoming.ad@ed.tum.de).
