Entry levels:	<p>BA students: BA students are placed in a Unit according to available space. Each Unit awards 30 ECTS upon successful completion.</p> <p>MA students are offered a choice between the available Studios. Each Studio awards 30 ECTS upon successful completion.</p> <p>Studio/Unit descriptions are prepared for an academic year, and are available shortly before the start of the Fall semester.</p>
Academic important aspects	<p>Presence requirements are in force both in the Units and Studios. Failure to comply with the presence requirements will result in being barred from the examination. No re-examinations in case of failed examination is offered, except in case of illness.</p> <p>Please note: we do not use course codes or numbers</p>
Course requirements:	All exchange students are expected to follow the complete Unit or Studio outline
Course content/teaching method:	<p>It is very important to understand that the semester at the Aarhus School of Architecture is NOT divided up into classes and studios. In order to reflect the professional methods of the architecture profession, the students are expected to work as if they were employed in an architecture or design company.</p> <p>You can therefore consider a semester with the Aarhus School of Architecture as a semester-long Studio class.</p>
Examination:	The final semester project is graded. No individual Unit or Studio elements are graded.
Living expenses:	<p>Living expenses: What to expect – please note, a student’s budget varies depending on how much their personal spending amounts to. Student living costs in Denmark is not that different from that of other European countries.</p> <p>You should expect to spend up to €1300 per month.</p>
