Recommended language skills

French is our main teaching language. There are no formal language requirements for incoming students at Ensa Paris-Est.

However, to attend bachelors' level classes, intermediate level of French (B1 or B2 level) is highly recommended before arrival.

To attend masters' level classes, a C1 level of French is recommended before arrival.

Some classes are taught in English ([Master Architecture and Experience](#)) for postgraduate students. A B2-C1 English level is also recommended to attend those classes.

Incoming students are able to attend a 30-hour French class, and architectural visits in Paris guided by an architect take place at the beginning of September during the week.
