





Decisions about admissions will be made latest within 2 weeks after closing the application.

### **ACADEMIC INFORMATION**

#### Language(s) of instruction:

Undergraduate courses at Technion are primarily taught in Hebrew, however we offer courses taught in English in a wide range of disciplines. Preliminary course lists can be found <u>here.</u>

Graduate-level courses are available for students who meet the requirements.

<u>Please note:</u> the language of graduate-level courses may be switched to English upon request by an international student, at the discretion of the course lecturer.

#### **Architecture Students**

Architecture students need to submit the applications by **May 1** of the previous academic year for the year they wish to enroll, including a portfolio and an official letter from their home university with their class ranking (top 50%).

#### Language requirements

Students from non-English speaking countries must submit one of the following documents:

- TOEFL certificate minimum score: **80**
- TOEIC certificate minimum score: 850
  - IELTS minimum Band **7**
  - CEFR scores: minimum **B2** 
    - Duolingo: minimum **110**
- Language certificate issued by home university





### **COSTS & WELFARE**

#### **Estimated Costs**

Application fee: 60\$ for non-ERASMUS+ students Administrative Fee: 250\$ Israeli Health Insurance: 10.20 NIS/day Housing on campus: approx. 1,250 NIS/month Campus fees: approx. 500 NIS/semester (depending on semester) \*Please note that these fees do not include the cost of living expenses estimated at \$2,500 per semester.

#### **Health insurance**

Students must have an Israeli health insurance policy arranged before arriving in Israel. Academic arrangements will not be completed without proof of Israeli health insurance. ### **MISCELLANEOUS**

#### Housing

On-campus housing is limited. If housing on campus is unavailable, we offer students assistance in finding affordable housing off-campus. Please find further information <u>here</u>.

#### Visa requirements

International students must have an A/2 student visa. The visa must be issued in the student's home country. Please find further information <u>here</u>.

**Work permit** 

International students are not permitted to work in Israel.

#### Professional Internship (for semester Exchange students only)

Students who come to the Technion for a semester abroad have the option of undertaking a professional internship at a hi-tech or start-up company. Working as an intern allows students to apply the engineering and scientific principles learned in the classroom to a real-world professional environment. Internships are unpaid positions taken over a period of at least 10 weeks (minimum 200 hours) and grant 3 academic credit points. Internships can be undertaken during the winter (January-March) or summer (June-August) at a cost of \$1,500.





### **STUDENT LIFE**

#### **Hebrew Course**

Technion offers a free Hebrew course for international students, emphasizing practical language skills. Detailed information on the curriculum and registration will be provided closer to the start of the semester.

#### **Social Activities**

The Dean of Students Office arranges movie nights, lectures, day trips, hikes, group dinners, ect. especially for international students.

#### **Sports Facilities**

The campus provides a diverse array of sports facilities, featuring a gymnasium, fitness center, Olympic-sized swimming pool, as well as tennis and squash courts, and a basketball court.
